 Report No.6 of 2016 renumbered as Report No.25 was accepted by this Court vide order dated 23rd July, 2018. The liability of the Third Party Noticee No.1 i.e. MSR Food Processing against Defendant No.2, National Spot Exchange Ltd. (NSEL), has been accepted for Rs.8,81,81,940.70/-.

2. No one has appeared on behalf of the Third Party Noticees. The Third Party Notice No.5 of 2014 stands decreed in favour of Defendant No.2 being NSEL and against MSR Food Processing, Third Party Noticee No.1 and legal heirs of proprietor of Third Party Noticee No.1 late Mr. Sampatrao being 1a to 1c for Rs.8,81,81,940.70. The rate of interest determined by the Court is 9% p.a. from the date of accrual of the cause of action/default.

3. Defendant No.2 NSEL reserves its rights for a decree against other Third Party Noticee No.2 in the event of Defendant No.2 being unable to recover the decretal amount against Third Party Noticee No.1.

 The sealing of decree is dispensed with under Rule 314 of the Bombay High Court (Original Side) Rules.
